- 1) Write the list out in a colour that you feel to be a good choice for Easter, and after each word, write the number of syllables it contains. **Ex:** *sepulchre - 3*
- 2) Write each word in the list again, and identify each word as a part of speech. **Ex:** *sepulchre - noun*
- 3) Write the adjectives formed from the same base word as each of these list words: *sepulchre *vigil *shroud *apostle **Ex:** *sorrow - sorrowful*
- 4) Write the infinitive form for the verb formed from the same base word as each of the following: *exultation *resurrection *forgiveness **Ex:** *witness – to witness*
- 5) Use each list word in separate sentences that are phrased in advanced vocabulary, begin with different first words, and require varied punctuation at the endings. Make sure each sentence fits the Easter theme.
- 6) Haiku poetry is a centuries old style of traditional Japanese poetry. It is written in the following pattern:

5 syllables, telling **where**

7 syllables, telling **what**

5 syllables, telling **when**
